

Dr. Kristin Nagy Catz has served as Director of University Assessment at Southern Oregon University for over eight years. She oversaw the periodic review of all academic and support programs at the institution. She designed and ran the Academic Program Review as well as assessment reporting process across campus. In addition to serving as Director of University Assessment, she was also the coordinator of an SOU graduate program and previously sat on SOU's university-wide graduate council. As part of the coordination of the graduate program, she taught a year-long sequence on research writing and methods. She was one of the lead authors of SOU's NWCCU accreditation report and served as both a participant and chair of NWCCU evaluation teams. She is currently the chair of the state of Oregon's Learning Outcomes and Assessment Committee, which is comprised of representatives from all of the Oregon public universities and community colleges. As chair of LO&A, she has organized two statewide conferences for faculty professional development. She has been the institutional lead on the Multi-State Collaborative/VALUE project at SOU and is an expert scorer using the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AAC&U) value rubric to evaluate critical thinking of students across the nation. SOU is a Liberal Education and America's Promise (LEAP) school, and she has represented Oregon in its LEAP initiatives.

Prior to her time at SOU, she worked at the University of California Berkeley's Lawrence Hall of Science on several research grants focused on curriculum development and assessment projects. She was the Assessment Specialist for numerous projects including Activation Lab, SEPUP, Kepler, YO!, ACES, Seeds of Science & Roots of Reading, and Ocean Literacy Index. She has her Ph.D. in Science Education and Human Development from Vanderbilt University, her Master's from the University of Cincinnati in Biological Sciences, and her Bachelor's degree from Vanderbilt University in Molecular Biology.
